

Prof. Dr. Qaisar Abbas assumed the charge as Vice Chancellor University of Sargodha on September 10, 2022. Prof. Dr. Qaisar Abbas was appointed as UOS Vice Chancellor on regular basis for a period of four years through a notification issued by the Punjab Higher Education Department "No. SO (Univ.) 5-1/2018.VOL-III dated 10.09.2022."

Dr. Abbas acquired a PhD degree in Human Resource Development from Nankai University in China, and MSc and MPhil in Economics from Quaid-i-Azam University in Pakistan. He has extensive experience in academia, having served as Dean of the Faculty of Business Administration and Director of the Lahore campus at COMSATS University Islamabad. He has also held various leadership roles at COMSATS University Islamabad (CUI), including Provost, Convener of the Campus Selection Committee, Convener of the Board of Studies of Management Sciences, and Convener of the Board of Faculties of Business Administration and Board Member of Governor CUI in Pakistan.

He is a highly accomplished researcher with numerous publications to his credit, including 38 in national and international journals, and a number of conference proceedings and presentations. He has also completed two research projects funded by the Higher Education Commission of Pakistan and CUI. He has also experience of supervising PhD students and has helped launch an international research journal. Dr. Abbas has also been actively involved in organizing a number of international workshops, seminars, conferences and forums.

SELECTION ON MERIT CAN IMPROVE HIGHER EDUCATION SECTOR IN PUNJAB

Four Vice Chancellors of public sector universities met with the Minister of Higher Education Punjab Raja Yassir Humayun Sarfraz. Prof. Dr. Qaisar Abbas, Vice Chancellor of the University of Sargodha, Dr. Muhammad Kamran, Vice Chancellor of MNS UET, Dr. Muhammad Ramzan, Vice Chancellor of Emerson University Multan, and Dr. Javaid Akhtar, Vice Chancellor of the University of Sahiwal discussed issues concerning to the higher education sector.


The Syndicate of the University of Sargodha, in its first meeting of the year held on September 27, 2022, cleared the year-long backlog by taking remarkable decisions in favor of its employees and the students. Keeping in view a large number of agenda items, another meeting of the Syndicate was held on November 04, 2022.

The meetings were presided over by the Vice Chancellor Prof. Dr. Qaisar Abbas, who briefed the Syndicate members about ongoing educational, research and developmental activities of the Campus. The key feature of the Syndicate meeting was the approval of the budget for the fiscal year 2022-23. The body also approved an increment in the salaries of the university employees as per the decision of the Punjab government.

The Registrar Waqar Ahmad presented the agenda of the meetings, while the Vice Chancellor briefed the House about the educational and research achievements of the university. The Syndicate members appreciated the progress of the varsity on the academic as well as administrative fronts under the dynamic leadership of Prof. Dr. Qaisar Abbas.

On the recommendations of the finance and planning committee of the University, the Syndicate approved a 15 per cent increase in the salaries of university employees. The house also approved the pending 25pc disparity reduction allowance for the employees of BS-1 to 19 subjected to an approval by the Governor/Chancellor. The Body also approved recommendations of the selection board regarding appointment of the faculty members. The syndicate, on the recommendation of the Academic Council, also restored the departments of Punjabi, Persian and Arabic, which were merged with Urdu & Oriental languages previously.

BUDGET ALLOCATION 2022-23





Kistafin visited University of Sargodha on September 15 to discuss the matters of mutual interests. The Ambassador was cordially welcomed by the Vice Chancellor Prof. Dr. Qaisar Abbas. ACADEMIC TIES WITH OIC (MEMBER STATES OF AFRICAN REGIONS)

An alliance of Islamic Universities of Africa (AIUA) and the University of Sargodha (UoS) have signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for bilateral cooperation and academic excellence through joint ventures. The Vice Chancellor Prof. Dr. Qaisar Abbas, 15 Vice Chancellors and representatives of the AIUA signed the agreement.

- A three-year Associate Degree Program will be introduced under a Joint Technical Education Program. In this program, the students will study two years of theoretical courses at the University and year-long practical training from Chinese universities. A joint degree will be awarded after the completion.
- The manpower for local Economic Zones and CPEC Industries & Special Economic Zones (SEZs) will be provided effective training, quality assessment, and certification by launching CCTE Model Sino-Pak Dual Diploma Vocational & Technical Joint Education Program.
- Increase cooperation in developing information-based vocational, and technical courses and introducing China's vocational education standards.
- Establish a Model Industrial Unit for value addition to the citrus export in a tri-party framework, including Tang, UOS, and the Sargodha Chamber of Commerce and Industry (SCC&I).
- Organizing joint conferences like China-Pakistan International Industrial-Academic Cooperation Alliance, and enabling students' participation in training, lectures, and workshops

3RD INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON "EDUCATIONAL SCIENCES AND RESEARCH ICESR 2022" TRANSFORMING EDUCATION FOR FUTURE: PRACTICES & PROJECTIONS

To highlight the prevailing issues in education and to recommend workable solutions in leading towards a better future, the Department of Education organized 3rd International Conference on "Educational Sciences and Research (ICESR) 2022" on December 14-15, 2022.

A two-day conference was organized under the theme of "Transforming Education for Future: Practices and Projections" in collaboration with the Higher Education Commission Islamabad, Punjab Higher Education Commission, and ORIC (UoS). It was a continuation of the ventures put forth by Sargodha University to contribute to the national academia.

The conference was aimed at promoting research culture in Pakistan through sharing practices and projections to suggest quality of curricular offerings, research, innovations in teaching and learning as well as spreading awareness about transformation of education for future.

The event's themes included assessment practices, creative and performing arts and craft, curriculum adaptation and innovation, early childhood care and education (ECCE), education for sustainable development, culture & diversity financial and entrepreneurial education, global citizenship education, health education, leadership and management, learning for justice, life skills and languages.

KEY POINTS

- The major educational challenge of this century is the acquisition of new sets of skills required by the students and teachers alike. Transforming education is the forefront international agenda. In simple words it is the adaptation of educational goals, scope, system and human resource to the changing needs of the society.
- Teachers as classroom managers and principles as school managers should use effective management practices in order to face the challenges of the 21st century.
- Need to take stock of the prevailing paradigms of learning in Pakistan and reset educational goals for transformative education by bridging the gap between latest research and practices, instill commitment and inculcate values among teachers and students for establishing a sustainable society.
- Enabling students to solve problems with limited resources

PAK-TESOL REGIONAL CONFERENCE ON "MODERN TRENDS IN ENGLISH LANGUAGE TEACHING"

The Department of English University of Sargodha in collaboration with Pak-TESOL, US Mission Pakistan, Regional English Language Office (RELO) US Embassy, and Allama Iqbal Open University (AIOU) organized a two-day conference titled "Modern Trends in English Language Teaching" on 21-22 November.

The conference was aimed at promoting "English Language Teaching in Sargodha" and was followed by two days Training Workshop later. It brought eight International and National Keynote speakers on stage and gathered almost 700 participants and 52 presenters from near and far. During the event, speakers and panelists talked about issues of vital concern, generated meaningful discussions and sparked ideas about bringing innovation to ESL classrooms.

The conference was followed by Pak-TESOL two-day workshop on New trends in English Language Teaching. The session was attended by 45 faculty members from the university and affiliated colleges and received hands-on practice in eight different training modules including Academic Writing, Culturally Responsive Teaching, Student-Centered Approaches, Process Pedagogy, 21st Century Skills, and Corpus-Driven Approaches in ELT. The participants expressed their deep appreciation for Pak-TESOL and the Department of English UOS for creating an unmatched opportunity to receive training from an impressive line of resource persons.

KEY POINTS

- Build a critical approach for analyzing texts and also broaden their horizons by disseminating ELT-specific knowledge to academia, policymakers, and stakeholders in the field.
- Create awareness about the current ELT trends and explore ways to adapt them to the local context.
- Reflect on our own ELT practices and identify areas for improvement.
- Develop the intellectual, personal and professional abilities of ELT practitioners.
- The need to revisit language research being done in Pakistani universities and make it more attuned to the present needs.

- Foster a sense of community among the participants so that they work together to reform ELT practices in the region.
- Encouraging the students to use digital material in English language teaching methods and the use of the English language for educational purposes.
- English being the most important language of science, technology, education, and diplomacy at the global level, by having command over it, the effective view of Pakistan could be conveyed to the international community.
- Improve the unreliable evaluation process typically associated with traditional assessment methods like tests and examinations and look for alternative assessment methods that foster critical thinking and communication skills.
- Teaching practices require a paradigm shift from teacher-led classrooms to student-centered instruction which enables students to take charge of their own learning.
- Need to keep the local community of practice alive and work together to create local solutions.

SOLVING NOVEL CHALLENGES, SPEAKERS

The Department of Mathematics, University of Sargodha organized various academic activities including seminar, national conference and an international symposium to highlight the importance of Mathematics in other disciplines.

The events were held under the title of "Importance of Mathematics in Finance and Economics, the 3rd National Conference on Mathematics and Applications 2022, and a day-long International Symposium on Mathematical Sciences" respectively. Renowned mathematicians from across the world highlighted the role of mathematics in thinking logically.

KEY POINTS

- Being a core science, the importance of mathematics has already been established for physical sciences and has recently been recognized in life sciences.
- Fractal interpolation focuses on managing the nonlinear issues of natural as well as social sciences efficiently. It fills the majority of the loopholes that have been overlooked by the traditional interpolation approach.
- Coincidence and common fixed-point results of set-valued mappings satisfying certain generalized graphic F-contractive conditions on a family of sets endowed with a graph.
- Evaluation of entropy generation has shown to be a helpful technique for tackling improvements in thermal characteristics since it yields insight that cannot be obtained from energy analysis.
- There is a need for curriculum revision, considering the importance of mathematics in the life sciences as a marvelous opportunity to develop and meet novel challenges and successfully achieve new avenues of research.
- Mathematical theories used in the context of finance and economics can have effective practical applications in real life.

TO INTEGRATE OVERALL GROWTH-PROMOTING POLICY



Dr. Sohail Jehangir Malik is a well-known researcher in the field of developmental policy, with a wide range of expertise including agricultural policy, public sector resource mobilization, budget development, technology choice, biodiversity, poverty analysis, rural finance, food security, and nutrition, and social safety nets. He is particularly known for his work in Pakistan and internationally.

KEY POINTS

- Agricultural development is one of the most powerful tools to end extreme poverty and to feed a projected 9.7 billion people by 2050.
- Pakistan's agriculture sector contributes about 24 % of the GDP. But agriculture-driven growth, poverty reduction, and food security are at risk in Pakistan and our economy is facing a lot of problems.
- Information asymmetry is the biggest cause of market inefficiency resulting in high prices for consumers and low returns for farmers.
- There is a need for a holistic policy approach to integrate the overall growth-promoting policy framework. Catalyze the system to generate and propagate independent knowledge that makes perverse decision-making.
- The introduction of "Baseerat" and "Umeed" mobile application app and a network containing agriculture commodity price information & comparison across Pakistan over time.



- Growth in the agriculture sector is two to four times more effective in raising income among the poorest compared to other sectors.
- The application enables the comparison of commodity prices from the large dataset of officially reported wholesale markets with what farmers report they are receiving in those market areas thus ensuring transparency; highlighting margins; eliminating inefficiencies; and, unleashing the full potential of agricultural markets for inclusive growth.

A GRAND NATIONAL DIALOGUE ON POPULATION AND FOOD SECURITY

The Pakistan Institute of China Studies (PICS) University of Sargodha in collaboration with the Islamabad Policy Research Institute (IPRI) and the Institute of Regional Studies (IRS) organized a grand national dialogue on "Population and Food Security" on October 27, 2022.

The debate emphasized the population and food security issues as a serious human security threat and highlighted an agricultural loss of billions in recent floods.

KEY POINTS

- Food security and population are fundamental problems, and that Pakistan is at the cusp of a meltdown.
- Issues such as population explosion, drainage of resources, changing dietary habits and climate change are affecting global food security, especially in a resource-starved and highly populous country like Pakistan.
- Integrated planning, climate-smart agricultural practices, and population control through education and women empowerment could impend population explosion and containing food security threats.
- Food insecurity stems from economic insecurity, lack of resources and lower income inequality.
- 38% food is insecure and Pakistan needs integrated policy, alternative food research and resource introspection as solutions.
- Need to introduce vertical farming due to shrinking lands to real estate development. An integrated system is needed to take benefit from the natural resources of Pakistan.
- Shrinking of crop yield is directly linked with farmers outsourcing crops to unskilled labor, affecting overall agricultural production.
- Malnutrition sits at the very core of our food insecurity which serves several larger social and health issues.

STRATEGIES FOR PREVENTION OF DENGUE FEVER



To discuss the "Dengue" transmission routes, rates, and role of environmental factors in contest of the recent flood of 2022, the Department of Entomology, College of Agriculture hosted an international webinar and workshop under the title of "Strategies for the control of dengue fever mosquitoes" on December 07.

The speakers briefly described the dengue fever mosquito's biology, life cycle, its genetics and identification. The participants of workshop learned in detail the methods and preventive measures that could help in eradicating the dengue fever mosquito. After the deliberations, participants were provided training for identification of dengue fever mosquito larvae and adults in laboratory. More than 200 Participants attended the workshop in the seminar hall of the College of Agriculture.

KEY POINTS

- Dengue fever is an endemic in Pakistan, however historic flooding has triggered a sudden rise in cases during 2022.
- Mosquitoes spread the virus that causes dengue fever. Most people do not experience symptoms. However, if they do, the symptoms are often mild.
- Accurate identification of dengue mosquito is important.
- Preventive measures like destruction of its breeding sites are critical
- Early recognition and treatment can help manage symptoms and prevent fatalities.
- The best way to prevent dengue fever is to take steps to avoid mosquito bites.
- Coping the incidences of vector born disease through novel ecofriendly strategies.
- Proper fumigation and use of repellents are important measures.
- Need to talk about the past, present, and future perspectives of dengue infection in Pakistan.
- Eliminating or reducing the number of mosquito breeding sites, such as by removing standing water from containers around the home.
- Using mosquito repellent and wearing protective clothing, such as long-sleeved shirts and pants.

- Keeping windows and doors closed or screened to prevent mosquitoes from entering the home.
- Using air conditioning or fans to create a breeze that makes it harder for mosquitoes to bite.
- Staying indoors during peak mosquito biting hours, typically dawn and dusk.
- Getting rid of or covering water storage containers, such as old tires or buckets, that can collect rainwater and become breeding grounds for mosquitoes.
- Using mosquito nets while sleeping, especially in areas where dengue is common.
- Using insecticides to kill adult mosquitoes and larvicides to kill mosquito larvae in standing water.

- Regularly cleaning and maintaining swimming pools and other bodies of water to prevent the buildup of mosquito larvae.

SEMINARS MEASURES TO CONTROL THALASSEMIA URGED

The Department of the Social Work, University of Sargodha in collaboration with government of the Punjab organized a number of events in connection with the National Thalassemia Prevention Day on 8th Nov.

The events included a seminar on National Thalassemia Prevention Day followed by an Awareness Walk and a free Screening Camp at the University.

KEY POINTS

- Globally approximately 300-400 thousand children are annually born with inherited substantial Hb diseases and around 80 million are carriers of β-thalassemia.
- The disease also causes a negative impact on family members, who suffer mentally, socially, financially, and even physically.
- The burden of thalassemia on the patients is because of complications from the disease itself and consequence of treatment received by the patient.
- The severity of the disease often remains immensely variable. Children with thalassemia suffer from the disease's consequences and treatment complications.
- Many people are reluctant to and afraid of doing the screening test due to societal norms and its adverse effect on the marriage prospects or due to ignorance about the disease.
- Thalassemia causes immense psychosocial, physical, and financial burdens to patients and their families. It is required to enhance awareness by increasing the knowledge of the parents and caregivers about thalassemia.
- Need to highlight the challenges experienced by the family and caregivers; for instance, repeated blood transfusion as the dominant origin of tissue casualty, morbidity, and fatal clinical outcomes.


