argodha University awarded degrees to 83,683 students of BS, Master's, MPhil and PhD programs at its seventh convocation held on December 5. Pro-Chancellor Raja Yassir Humayun Sarfaraz, Punjab Minister for Higher Education presided over the ceremony on behalf of the Chancellor/Governor Punjab.

The degrees conferred include, 30 PhD, 1,343 MS/MPhil, 37,137 MA/MSc, 14,910 BS/BBA and 30,263 BA/BSc degrees, awarded to the students from disciplines of Medical and Health Sciences, Pharmacy, Agriculture, Sciences, Arts and Humanities and Social Sciences. Among them, 574 students with distinctions were honoured with medals.

This was the second convocation of the year, held to clear the backlog – last one held on April 25, awarding degrees to 78,700 graduates. The University has also planned two convocations for the year 2020, first in March and second in November, which will clear the further backlog.

The ceremony began in a ritualistic manner, with the entrance of the academic procession comprising the Pro-Chancellor, the Vice Chancellor and Deans of the seven faculties at the convocation venue. The prestigious ceremony was precise and delicate as bulk of the work was done a day earlier in the rehearsal.

Addressing the ceremony, Pro-Chancellor remarked that providing quality education, with compatible skills and relevancy of the subject to the requirements of international market, is the topmost priority of the government.

EXCERPTS FROM THE KEYNOTE ADDRESS

- In order to catch-up with the modern world, we have to remodel the higher education system with the primary focus on quality, then relevancy and accessibility.
- Instead of building more institutions, the focus should be on providing quality education in already established institutes. We don't need institutes imparting sub-standard education and producing unemployable graduates.
- The only way we can attract the foreign investors especially the high-tech companies is to have quality graduates at home. Because the companies



are preferring to set headquarters in other countries than taking the graduates to overseas.

 We are also working on building community colleges which will provide two-years associate degree programs that are relevant to the industry.

On the occasion, the Vice Chancellor presented a report on the performance of the University, highlighting the progressive reforms and international ranking of the University.

The colorful event of the convocation was attended by over 5,000 graduating students, their parents, and faculty members from each department.

The campus was filled with an air of excitement as the graduates – cladded in the graduation gowns – were celebrating their success and gathering memories by taking pictures with their parents and classmates.

SARGODHA UNIVERSITY WORKS OUT CONFUCIUS INSTITUTE FORMALITIES WITH CHINESE COUNTERPARTS

ollowing the signing of MoU between University of Sargodha and Hanban (Confucius Institute Headquarters) in Beijing in the presence of Prime Minister Imran Khan and Chinese premier Le Keqiang on October 8, 2019, Vice Chancellor Dr Ishtiaq Ahmad and Director Pakistan Institute of China Studies Dr Fazal ur Rahman participated in the 2019 International Chinese Language Conference" held on December 8-9 at Changsha, China.

On the sidelines of the Conference, Hanban organized a meeting among the three stakeholders of CI at Sargodha University i.e. Hanban, Henan Normal University (HNU) and Sargodha University (SU) to work out the details of Implementing Agreement between SU and Hanban. The high-level meeting was attended by Prof Ma Jianfei, Deputy Chief Executive of Hanban, Prof Zhao Guoxiang, Chairman of the Council at HNU, Vice Chancellor SU, Dr Ishtiaq Ahmad, Mr Zhong Heqing, Cultural Counsellor of the Chinese Embassy in Islamabad, and officials of the Provincial Education Ministry of Henan Province and the International Department of the

Henan Normal University.

Prof Jianfei welcomed SU's entry into the community of global CIs. He explained the key objectives of the CI and hoped that the fifth CI in Pakistan will play a pivotal role in developing deeper understanding of Chinese language and culture in Pakistan to bring the people of two brotherly countries closer.

Dr. Ahmad thanked Hanban, HNU and the Chinese Embassy for creating this exceptionally significant opportunity for SU, which will help Pakistani youth to acquire language skills, develop deep understanding of Chinese culture and civilization to become useful partners in development of China-Pakistan Economic Corridor as the flagship project of the Belt and Road Initiative. He explained the crucial role of SU for being located in the agricultural hub of Punjab and how he envisaged to build upon this opportunity to benefit the youth and local community.

The Chinese counterparts assured the Vice Chancellor of their full support and hoped the Cl at SU will be a milestone in the development of China-Pakistan relations.

The meeting at Changsha was followed by a visit to



HNU, which being a partner university will share the management of the CI at SU. During the formal meeting, the leaders and officials of the two universities shared their vision and discussed the processes to be undertaken for finalization of the Implementation Agreement. The meeting was attended by Prof Chang Junbiao, President of HNU, Prof Cheng Yunxiang, Dean of College of International Education, Prof Li Yongxian, Dean of School of Chinese and Literature, Prof Liang Xiaodong, Dean of Faculty of International Studies, Prof Liu Xianguo, Dean of College of Physical Education, Prof Duan Xu, Dean of College of Music and Dance, Prof Ding Xiaosheng, Party Secretary of Life Sciences, and Prof

Du Xuguang, Vice Dean of Academy of Fine Arts. The meeting concluded by agreeing that:

- The two sides will make preparations in line with Hanban's policies for establishing the CI and signing of the Implementation Agreement as soon as possible.
- CI will be used as a platform for cooperation in the other areas of common interest and resources available in the two universities.
- Exchange of short academic visits of faculty and students.
- Creating opportunities for split degree program and scholarships on reciprocal basis

n October 8, Pakistan's Prime Minister Imran Khan with Chinese Premier Li Keqiang, witnessed the signing of several bilateral cooperation agreements on infrastructure construction, the security of law enforcement, culture, education and media. Among these agreements, a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to establish the Confucius Institute (CI) at the Sargodha University (SU) was signed by Naghmana Hashmi, Pakistan's Ambassador to China and Ma Jianfei, Deputy Chief Executive of the Confucius Institute Headquarters-Hanban.

This Institute would be the fifth of its kind in Pakistan, in addition to the already established CIs at National University of Modern Languages, University of the Punjab, University of Karachi, and University of Agriculture, Faisalabad.

Initially, the idea of setting-up CI was floated during an in-house seminar, held on April 16 this year, with the heads of Confucius Institutes from Islamabad, Lahore and Faisalabad. Later, in July, SU signed MoU with the Henan Normal University (HNU) under which the two Universities decided to cooperate for establishing the Confucius Institute.

Under the provisions of the MoU with HNU, SU will provide the premises for CI that include space for a library, activity room and classrooms, besides logistical support to the teachers including facilitation of visas, and the Hanban will reciprocate by paying the salaries to the teaching staff, costs of teaching materials and other allied costs.

ABOUT **CONFUCIUS INSTITUTE**

Confucius Institute is a non-profit public educational organization affiliated with the Ministry of Education of the People's Republic of China whose aim is to promote Chinese language and culture, support teaching of local Chinese at the international level, and facilitate cultural exchanges.

As of September 30, 2019, there were 535 Confucius Institutes and 1,134 Confucius Classrooms in 158 countries (regions) of the world.

FUNCTIONS

- Promote and teach Chinese Culture and Language
- Develop Chinese Language courses, train teachers, hold the HSK Examination (Chinese Language proficiency test)
- Host cultural and artistic presentations, and provide information on Chinese education and culture
- Conduct cultural exchange activities by providing scholarships to the students

With the establishment of the Confucius Institute, SU is moving beyond agricultural cooperation, as a number of exchange agreements with Chinese counterparts, including with Lanzhou University in dryland agriculture and with South China Agricultural University in precisions agriculture and citrus research have been signed. With the development of China Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC), this initiative will strengthen bilateral ties s as understanding each other's culture and language is indispensable for bringing the people of the two countries together.

UNDERSTANDING CHINA: MR CHEN XIANG, DIRECTOR CHINA RADIO INTERNATIONAL, SPEAKS AT SU

akistan Institute of China Studies (PICS), Sargodha University organized a special lecture titled, 'Understanding China: Similarities and Differences between Pakistan and China' on November 26, to enhance the students' understanding of Chinese history and culture.

The lecture – held as part of the PICS's Distinguished Scholar's Lecture Series – was delivered by Mr Chen Xiang, Director China Radio International Confucius Classroom.

During the lecture, the Chinese dignitary introduced the audience with the richness of Chinese culture, sensitivities of its geography, diversity of ethnic composition, historical progress and developments they made centuries back when the Western world was benighted.

China was a poor agrarian country and Pakistan made significant contributions in its initial development, as the first Chinese pilot was trained by Pakistan International Airline (PIA) in 1950s.

The lecture dispelled some of the misconceptions about China Pakistan Economic Corridor and China's intentions to colonize Pakistan, which have been portrayed negatively by Western media.

KEY POINTS

- To create harmony and to further cement the bond of friendship between people of the two states, there is a need to enhance their understanding of each other's history, language and culture.
- Chinese philosophy is based on peace, harmony and balance. In its uninterrupted history of more than 5000 years; neither had they invaded any country nor did they colonize any region ever.
- There are 56 minorities ethnic groups in China among which 3% are Muslims who are living in peace with the majority Han and other minorities. The mistreatment of Muslims in China is propaganda waged by China's enemies to create cleavages between China and the Muslim world.
- Chinese people strongly believe that a nation should learn from its history, therefore every child is taught Chinese history from the beginning and all Chinese know their history well.
- China holds advanced-agricultural technology and can help Pakistan in modernizing its agriculture sector besides providing machinery and synthetic fertilizer to enhance crops yield.
- Under CPEC, Pakistan will be able to boost its agricultural output and improve the trade balance between the two countries, which is heavily in favour of China.

BRIDGING THE CHINESE LANGUAGE AND CULTURE BARRIER

Chinese Language Orientation Session

o shed light on the importance of learning Chinese language, PICS organized a special lecture of Ms Wang Sujing, Deputy Director, China Radio International (CRI) on 'What is the Chinese Language' on October 4, 2019. It was attended by Chinese language teachers, faculty members, and students from various departments of the University. To take full advantage of opportunities and projects under CPEC, learning Chinese language has become the dire need of time.

Ms Wang taught some of the basic words and expressions of the Chinese language used in dayto-day communication; trained the attendees in pronouncing them; and shared historical evolution of Chinese language and characters. Chinese Language is one of the oldest languages with three thousand years of history. In 21% century, 21% of the total population of the world speak Mandarin Chinese, hence making it the most spoken language of the world." She emphasized that learning the Chinese Language helps in understanding other similar languages spoken in Korea, Japan, Malaysia, Indonesia, and Singapore. At the end of the event, Ms Wang conducted a general quiz session with the students and distributed prizes among them.

SU STARTS CHINESE LANGUAGE CLASSES

Initially, faculty having Chinese exposure and students from six departments including International Relations & Politics, English, Urdu, Communication & Media Studies, Computer Sciences & Information Technology, and Noon Business School, have been selected for the training program while students from other departments will be included in the next cohort.

SU RETAINS POSITION AMONG TOP 500 ASIAN UNIVERSITIES



he University of Sargodha has retained its previous position in the prestigious QS Asia University Rankings 2020, making its name yet again in the list of Top 500 Asian universities.

According to the Quacquarelli Symonds (QS) World University Rankings: Asia 2020, Sargodha University "recorded the same rank achieved in 2019" i.e. in the 401-450 category of Asian universities.

Last week, the Times Higher Education (THE) also announced its subject-wise World University Rankings 2020, in which the University ranked 601+ for Life Sciences and 801+ Physical Sciences.

In the QS Rankings 2020, Sargodha University ranked 171+ for the International Research Network; 251+ for Academic and Employer Reputation; and 301+ for

Faculty Student Ratio, PhD faculty, research publications and student exchange.

SU-NAB Ceremony STUDENTS OF EX-PPP SUB-CAMPUSES GET BACK THEIR 'LOOTED' MONEY

n October 2, 2019, first ever in the history of Pakistan, Sargodha University initiated the process of reimbursing Rs.57 million, the excess fee charged from the students of ex-private-public partnership (PPP) sub-campuses in Lahore and Mandi Bahauddin, recovered by the National Accountability Bureau (NAB), Lahore, through plea bargain with the owners of these sub-campuses.

In a special ceremony held at the Main Campus, Director NAB Lahore Mr Niaz Hassan and Vice Chancellor Sargodha University Dr Ishtiaq Ahmad distributed the cheques worth of Rs.3.38 million among more than 200 students of Doctor of Physiotherapy (DPT) in the first phase. In total, 6,000 students will be paid back the money that was looted by the management of ex-sub-campuses, which were closed down last January on over charging fee unlawfully.

Speaking on the occasion, Director NAB Lahore pointed out that the main charge, in this case, was cheating public at large as the respondents misused authority for personal interests; illegally established two PPP sub-campuses; made excess admissions in unapproved programs; overcharged fee from students; issued forged documents to students; made illegal appointments; awarded tenders to the favourite bidders; and deducted the amount of fine imposed on a contractor for delaying the

construction work.

Addressing the ceremony, the Vice Chancellor stressed the importance of developing a proper preventive mechanism to obstruct such corrupt acts from happening. While appreciating the efforts of SU faculty and management, he shed light on the strategies implemented to combat the daunting challenges SU faced in accommodating the Students of ex-PPP sub-campuses with extremely limited resources.

Students heaved a sigh of relief and thanked NAB as well as current SU administration while receiving cheques. On the pretext of workshops and software training, ex-PPP sub-campuses were charging extra fee from students, and imposed fines for multiple fake reasons.

We are grateful to NAB and SU for not only facilitating us at the Main Campus but also compensating the financial loss we faced. The Main Campus is providing all the learning opportunities which we were deprived of in the sub-campus. With the cooperation of NAB and SU, our trust upon public institutes is restored.

■ The publishing potential of a research topic principally depends upon its compatibility with current trends, application of appropriate methods and reporting results effectively, hence, it should be considered at the stage of proposal development.

INDIA'S HEGEMONIC DESIGN IMPERILS REGIONAL PEACE AND STABILITY

he surge of Hindu nationalism, with the initiation of Narendra Modi's Hindutva project in India, would not only have domestic implications for India but could have serious repercussions for regional peace and security, warned security experts while speaking at join seminar organized by Sargodha University and Centre for International Strategic Studies (CISS) titled: "India's Strategic Posture and Implications for Strategic Stability in South Asia" on December 17

The discussion was held in the context of the Pulwama incident and abrogation of Article 370, which has intensified Indo-Pak ties along with the challenges of the rise of extremist narrative in Indian politics and implications for regional peace.

KEY POINTS

- The abrogation of Article 370 and 35-A by Indian Prime Minister Modi is the fulfillment of a long ideological yearning under the Hindutva ideology promoted by the RSS, to make a predominantly homogenous Hindu Nation to the detriment of Muslim and other minorities of India.
- Indian nationalistic agenda under the banner of Hindutva has serious repercussions for the regional peace and strategic stability. Besides, Indian provocative actions along LOC and Balakot strikes indicate an aggression conventional posture towards Pakistan and Indian hegemonic designs.
- The emerging environment post lifting of curfew in Kashmir will set the tone for an indigenous armed struggle. Such a development will have greater consequences for Pakistan than Kashmiris, as it will unleash a campaign against Pakistan on a well-beaten track of being sponsor of terrorism and instrumental in physically supporting violence in Kashmir.
- India's huge military spending is increasing conventional imbalance leading to arms race and crisis instability in South Asia. Asymmetry beyond certain limits can lead to deterrence failure in a volatile nuclear theatre like South Asia. The current situation is exacerbated by the Indo-US strategic partnership where India is considered as a key player to US Indo-Pacific strategy to contain China. India talks of Full-Spectrum Conflict as opposed to Full-Spectrum Deterrence (FSD) of Pakistan and is preparing to fight a two-front war against China and Pakistan.
- India's growing conventional and nuclear capabilities are a threat to the strategic stability of South Asia. India is

pursuing a strategy of 'escalation dominance' by purchasing new weapons and modernizing its old weapons. India seems to be developing a nuclear arsenal that goes beyond its policy of credible deterrence and No First Use (NFU) policy. The pronouncements from former Indian defense officials and corresponding pursuit of enhanced conventional and nuclear capabilities reveal a strategy of pre-emptive counter force strike against Pakistan in a crisis.

- Revoking of the special status of the Kashmir, statements which threaten abandoning of NFU, and a move towards conventional and nuclear pre-emption reflect belligerent and irresponsible behavior. These are indications of an extremist, aggressive turn in India's foreign and security policy.
- The emerging strategic environment forces Pakistan to respond to an evolving threat spectrum. Pakistan's Full Spectrum Deterrence (FSD) is based on spectrum of threats instead of spectrum of capabilities. FSD within the ambit of Credible Minimum Deterrence is not going towards attaining maximalist position to achieve entire spectrum of capabilities as was the case in cold war between USA and Soviet Union.
- Balakot Crisis showed that Pakistan has adequate credible conventional response but we should keep improving our conventional and nuclear capabilities to cover the entire spectrum of threats.
- Pakistan will have to continue to put up its guard and invest in maintaining the credibility of its

- conventional and nuclear capabilities. It needs to invest in its naval capabilities because weakness in any arm of conventional force can lower the nuclear threshold.
- Nuclear Weapons are weapons of deterrence and a nuclear war will have no winners and have grave environmental consequences. Pakistan needs to stand prepared against sustained aggressive posturing by India, in the backdrop of CBM fatigue. It should continue to invest in maintaining a credible conventional force posture that supplements its strategic forces as part of full spectrum deterrence.
- In the end, interactive Q&A session held which marked the enthusiastic participation of the students and faculty who asked a number of questions on India's nuclear policy and strategic developments and their implications for the stability in the South Asian region.
- It was reinforced in the gathering that informed debates on strategic crisis stability and escalation control in South Asia needs to be undertaken in the educated circles in the country.

akistan Engineering Council (PEC) has recently granted reaccreditation to the College of Engineering and Technology, Sargodha University for the fall session (2013 and 2014) of undergraduate programs including Electrical Engineering and Mechanical Engineering. The PEC team made specific observations in Accreditation, Interim, and Re-Zero visits, which were addressed and submitted through the Self-Assessment Report (SAR) by the College administration.

The College resolved the deficiencies, weak areas, and concerns by hiring qualified PhD faculty; providing training and development programs to the faculty members; segregating labs; assuring the functionality; installing new equipment in labs; increasing the electrical and mechanical

engineering books in the Central Library from 681 to 1000; facilitating students' visit to the local industry; and implementing the Outcome-Based Education (OBE) system.

The College, in collaboration with PEC, is following the OBE system for all engineering programs by finalizing the Program Educational Objectives (PEOs), adapting the Program Learning Outcomes (PLOs), and updating the Course Learning Outcomes (CLOs).

The difficulty level of the course learning is also in line with the three domains of the Bloom's Taxonomy, namely cognitive, affective, and psychomotor. Furthermore, the College administration is working on documentation for the National Technology Council (NTC) visit for the accreditation of technology programs.

SUGARCANE INTERCROPPING DRILL PATENT REGISTERED

ssistant Professor Dr Abdul Rehman from the Department of Agronomy, College of Agriculture, Sargodha University, has become the first Pakistani national to invent first of its kind "Multipurpose and Multifunctional Sugarcane Intercropping Drill," with the help of his research team and the local industry.

The Patent Office of the Government of Pakistan has granted the exclusive right to use the invention in industrial applications, which allows to make, import, offer for sale, stock, and use the product obtained directly by means of the process so patented under 143094, subject to the Patents Ordinance, 2000.

The invention will meet the diversified needs of small-scale farmers by maximizing land utility, increasing total yield, and earning high monetary returns.

ABOUT THE DRILL

The sugarcane intercropping drill, with manually removable and adjustable parts, is a tractor-drawn agricultural implement, designed to perform functions of various tillage implements, including soil cultivation, breaking of clods, leveling of the soil surface, and drilling of seed and fertilizer in a single pass.

With this intercropping drill, about 50% of the existing area of sugarcane can additionally be utilized for the sowing of wheat, gram, maize, vegetables, clovers, and pulses.


